

Linking Brainshark and Your Intranet

To help you make the interface between your applications or intranet and Brainshark as seamless as possible, we provide `loginandgo.asp`, a page that takes user information as input and logs into a specified Brainshark company, displaying either the user's normal home page or a specified different page. When the user logs out of Brainshark, Loginandgo can display a specified destination page and, if desired, pass that page information about a presentation or account.

How to use LoginAndGo

To use `loginandgo.asp`, you must create a page that, when invoked, sends the Brainshark login information (via either HTTP or HTTPS) to `loginandgo.asp` on the Brainshark site. The URL to which you must post this information is:

<http://www.brainshark.com/brainshark/public/login/loginandgo.asp>

If you need to pass URL query string arguments as part of the LoginAndGo DEST or LOGOUT input parameters, or if you need to include query arguments that contain spaces, you must use the HTML form-based method. For example, to specify `LOGOUT=REDIR:http://www.somecompany.com/page?arg1=val1&arg2=val2`, you would have to submit the request as an HTML form.

No Banner

Brainshark supports displaying the catalog and advanced search pages without banners. Customers who want to use the Brainshark application in a "framed" environment can leverage this feature to present those pages without any of the Brainshark banner, or menu bar area.

To access this feature, use the LoginAndGo as described in help, but add the following parameters to the LoginAndGo query string:

`&nb=1&dest=1` to load the catalog page without the banner or menu

`&nb=1&dest+2` to load the advanced search page without the banner or menu

You can also pass the `nb` and `dest` values in an HTML form.

The following sample HTML shows how you might construct an HTML frame set to load the catalog page:

<frameset rows="80,*" border="1" padding="3">
<frame src="nobanner-top.htm" name="upper" id="upper" frameborder="1"
scrolling="no" noresize marginwidth="0" marginheight="0">
<frame name="lower"
src="https://www.brainshark.com/brainshark/public/login/loginandgo.asp?CID=cid&UI
D=uid&PWD=pwd&NB=1&DEST=1">
</frameset>
</html>
```

In this example, **cid** is the Brainshark company id that the user wishes to log into, **uid** is the user name that the user wishes to use to login, and **pwd** is the password associated with the username.

Avoid Username and Password Maintenance

Brainshark also supports specifying the Unique Company Identifier for customers wishing to avoid maintaining the Brainshark username and password. For example, you can modify the code above to:

```

<frame src="nobanner-top.htm"name="upper"id="upper"frameborder="1"scrolling+"no"
noresize marginwidth="0"marginheight="0">
<frame
name="lower"src=https://www.brainshark.com/brainshark/public/login/loginandgo.asp?CID=
cid&uci&NB=1&DEST=1>
</frameset>
</html>
```

In this example, **cid** is the Brainshark company id the user wishes to log into and **uci** is the unique company identifier that the user wishes to sue to login.
