

From Brainshark to iPod™

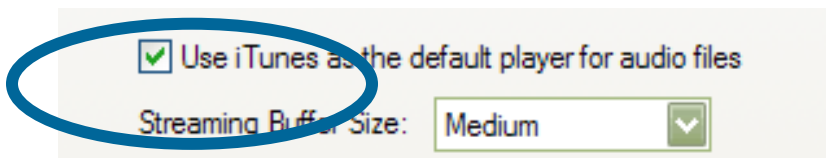
These days we are more mobile than ever and Brainshark has the devices that make it possible.

Setting iTunes™ as the default audio player

The first thing to do is to set iTunes™ as your default audio player. You can do this during installation of iTunes™ or you can modify it after you have already completed installation. Let's walk through this scenario.

To use iTunes for Internet playback:

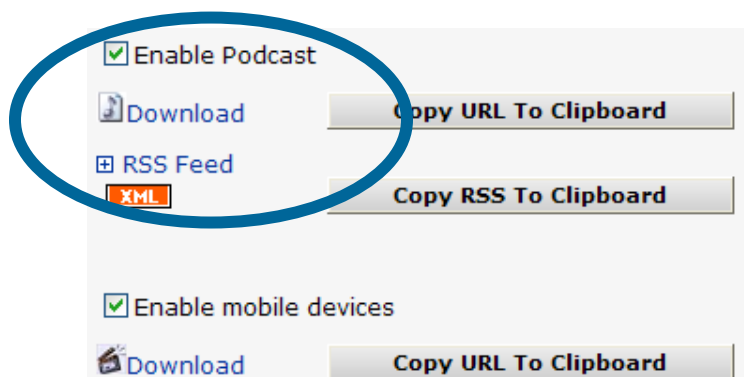
1. Choose Edit > Preferences.
2. Click the Advanced tab and click General.
3. Check "Use iTunes as the default player for audio files"



- Making this setting will mean that every time you open an audio file, iTunes™ will open and the file will become a part of your iTunes™ library.

Enable and Download Podcast

- Once the Brainshark presentation is finished, click Edit for that presentation and check the box to enable the Podcast version of the presentation. *Note Brainshark Mobile™ is a separate product; see instructions below.
- Click Apply and Brainshark will create the files; the screen will appear as shown in the image below.
- Click Download and choose to Open in iTunes™ now or Save to a folder and open in iTunes™ later.

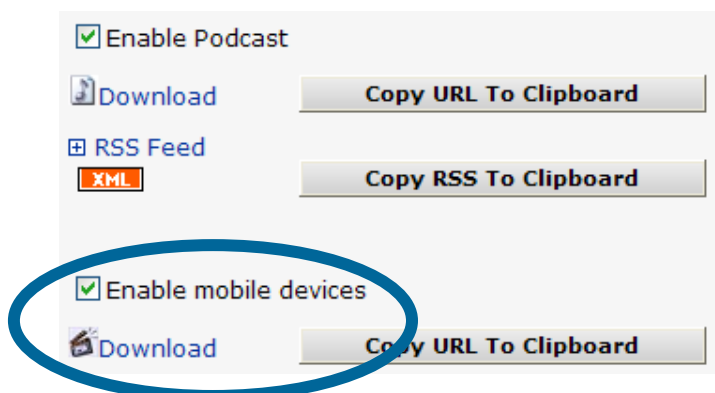


Upload to iPod™

- Once the MP3 audio file is in your iTunes™ library, you can upload it to your iPod™ the next time that you synchronize with iTunes™.

Brainshark Mobile™

- Brainshark Mobile™ is an additional feature that can be added to your Sharkive.
- Once enabled you will be able to create Windows Media Video (.wmv) files of your Brainshark presentations. These are files that make it possible to play the images and the audio on a Windows™ enabled device.
- If you wish to play the Brainshark Mobile™ file on your iPod™ then follow these steps:
 - Edit the presentation and check the box to enable the Mobile Device version of the presentation
 - Click Apply and Brainshark will create the files; the screen will appear as shown in the image below.



- Download the .wmv file from Brainshark
- Convert the .wmv to MPEG or Quicktime™ format in order to play it on the iPod™
- Upload to your iPod™ the next time that you synchronize with iTunes™.
