

Rapid Learning Dictionary

Brainshark Rapid Learning enables the learning management of students, courses, and curriculums with Brainshark content. Tracking and reporting is available on participation and performance. There are several terms and roles specific to the Rapid Learning application. This document defines terms commonly used when referring to Rapid Learning.

Rapid Learning Term	Definition
Student	Any registered user who can take a course in Rapid Learning
Group	A group of students. Students may belong to more than one group.
Learning Administrator	A registered user who has permissions to manage all aspects of the Rapid Learning application. He or she can create and manage: students, folders, student access, privileges, courses, curriculums, email templates, topics, and course authoring rights. He or she can grant permissions with respect to course authors, managers and/or learning administrators. The learning administrators can edit all courses and run all Rapid Learning reports.
Learning Manager	A registered user who has permissions to manage user records, run Rapid Learning reports, create groups of students, and enroll students and/or groups of students in courses.
Course Author	Registered users with permissions to create and define Brainshark courses and curriculums. They can enroll students and/or groups of students and run Rapid Learning reports.
Course	Brainshark content distributed through the Rapid Learning application.
Curriculum	A set of courses that students must take, either in prescribed or random format.
Open Enrollment	A course or curriculum that is available to all students and appears in the course catalog.
Limited Enrollment	A course or curriculum that is only available to those students who have been enrolled by a course author, learning manager, and/or learning administrator. It does not appear in the course catalog.
Course Catalog	A list of all open enrollment courses and curriculums that a student can choose to enroll in and take. A student can search by topic, title, description, and keywords.
Enrollment	An enrollment is a permanent record of a student's participation in a course or curriculum, and may include his/her level of achievement in that course or curriculum.
Current Enrollment	A course or curriculum that the student is enrolled in but has not yet completed; and the course has not expired.
Prior Enrollment	Courses or curriculums that have either been completed or have expired.
Learning Locker	Also known as My Enrollments, this is the initial screen that a student sees upon entering the Rapid Learning application. It is a dashboard view of the current and prior enrollments. From this area, students may take courses or curriculums they have not yet completed, and/or print certificates from courses they have completed.
